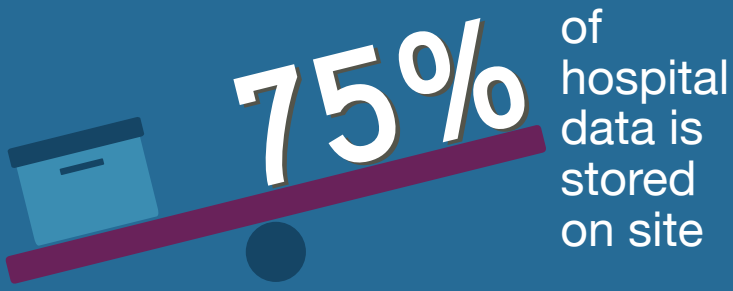

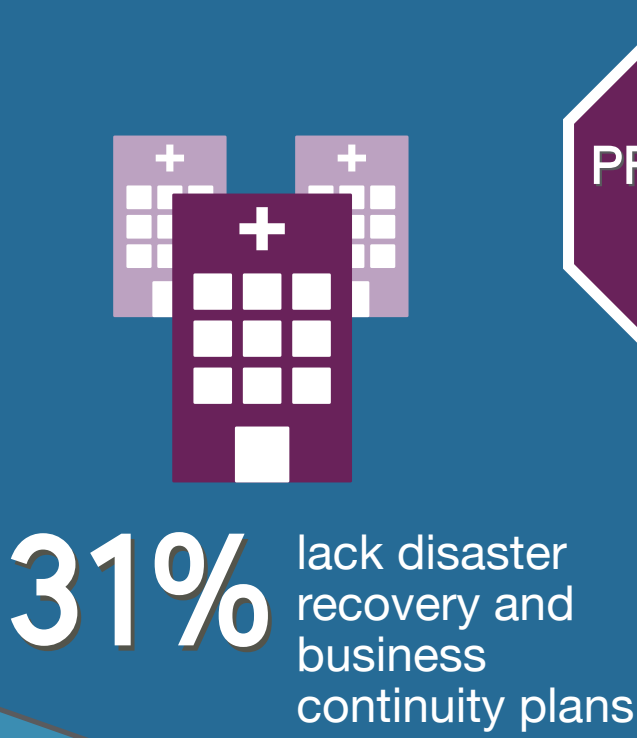
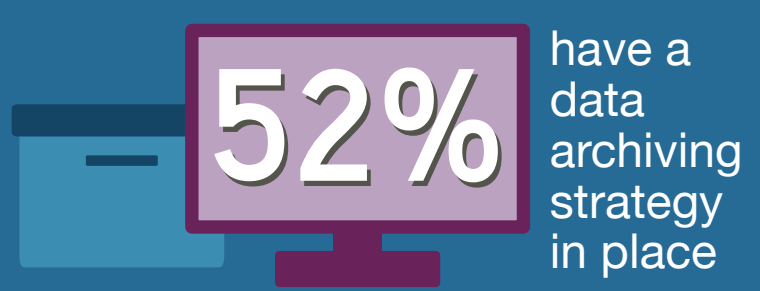
Hospitals Need to Update Data Storage Practices
